Official Rules and Regulations

The following rules and regulations are for the protection and benefit of all members. The club manager and lifeguards are authorized to require those violating any of these rules to leave the premises. Any failure to comply with these rules may be considered sufficient cause for immediate suspension of all privileges of the offender for a period from one (1) to seven (7) days, and repeated violations can also be considered sufficient cause for termination of membership without refund.

The board reserves the right to decline membership renewal for any reasons. Use of these facilities constitutes acceptance of these rules and regulations.

Season Schedule:

- * Opening on: Saturday, May 26th
- * Only open weekends until Guilford County Schools are out in June.
- * Closing on: Labor Day Weekend

- The pool must be cleared by 7:50 pm (6:50pm on Sunday). All cars must leave by 8pm (7pm on Sunday) except for special occasions, events or situations. No long term parking is allowed on the property.
- The pool will be closed when necessary for maintenance and also at the discretion of the manager during inclement weather. Advance notice will be posted if possible. If the weather is questionable, please call to ensure that we are open.
- Swimmers will not be allowed in the water during electrical storms for thirty (30) minutes after the last clap of thunder, and/or flash of lightning. Once the pool has reopened, if the next break falls within 20 minutes, that break will be forfeited.
- “Break” will normally be announced for the last ten (10) minutes each hour. Break time will occur 7 days a week. Only responsible adult swimmers (18 years or older) may take children at the age of three (3) and under for a “dip”. This is intended to be supervision of the child by the adult and the adult must be with the child constantly. Exceptions to this rule will be decided only by the pool manager if requested due to swim lessons or other approved reason.
- The protection of all children in the wading pool is the responsibility of their parents and is restricted to children **ages five (5) and under**. Parents (or responsible adult) must be in visual contact of their children at all times. Younger siblings (under the age of 18) do not qualify as a responsible adult.
- Children twelve (12) years old, and under are not permitted in the pool area unless they are accompanied by an adult. An adult is defined as another member eighteen (18) years of age or older, who accepts responsibility for the safety and discipline of that child.

8. All foods should be confined to the covered shelter eating area near the snack bar. Only water is allowed out of this area. No food or snacks are allowed in the children's wading pool area.
9. No ball playing of any kind is allowed within the pool enclosure area. There may be an exception to this rule, depending upon the capacity of the pool and area at certain times. The manager and lifeguards have the authority to change/alter this rule on a day-by-day, and hour-by-hour basis due to constant changing capacity during operating hours.
10. Boat rafts of any kind are not permitted in either the wading or main pool. Smaller floatation devices and rafts are allowed within the discretion of the pool manager, or lifeguards on a day-by-day basis pending overcrowded situations. During the ten (10) minute break adults are allowed any kind of floatation, with their respect to overcrowding.
11. No Diapers are allowed in either pool. Appropriate "swim pants" must be worn for infants and toddlers. Any accident(s) must be reported immediately to a lifeguard or the manager.
12. Children that cannot swim should not be left alone in the pool without parent supervision. Small children with floatation devices are NOT allowed in the deep end. Small children must pass a swim test to be allowed to swim in the deep end.
13. Unsafe activities such as: running, pushing, tripping, dunking or horseplay will not be tolerated. The pool manager or lifeguards have the authority to expel any persons who violate the rules and regulations. Repeated offenses committed by members under the age of 18 will result in a one month probationary period during which the parent must accompany the minor when coming to the pool, at all times. The board reserves the right to revoke any membership (without refund) based on inappropriate or unacceptable behavior.
14. The guardroom, the area behind the front desk, pump houses and the actual enclosed snack bar room are off limits except to staff, lifeguards and authorized personnel.
15. Profanity will not be tolerated at any time. The pool manager or lifeguards have the authority to expel any persons who violate the rules and regulations. Repeated offenses will result in one month probationary period. The board reserves the right to revoke any membership (without refund) based on inappropriate or unacceptable behavior.
16. No backwards diving off of the pool deck. Swimmers may only dive in designated areas.
17. No alcoholic beverages or containers are permitted within the pool enclosures or on the pool property, with the exception of private parties held after normal pool working hours. No under age drinking will be tolerated, including private parties. Any infraction of this will result in a revoking of the pool membership, without refund.
18. No glass containers of any kind are permitted in the pool enclosure.
19. The diving and swimming areas of the pool are divided by a floating lifeline. For safety reasons, any kind of sitting, standing or pulling on this lifeline will not be permitted.

20. Persons suffering from communicable illnesses, skin diseases, sores, fungus infections, eye, ear, nose or throat infections are prohibited from using the pool.
21. No radios or sound systems are permitted in the pool area except with personal earphones.
22. Current members must check in at the desk upon entering the pool, and verify membership if needed with a membership card or other identification. Any guest must also register and pay the guest fee of five dollars (\$5.00) per day. All guests must accompany an active member of the pool. Lifeguards are allowed to bring guests, when not on guard duty. Their guests must pay the five dollars per day fee, and are subject to all pool rules.
23. GUESTS: Paying guests may come only if they are accompanied by an active member and must follow the age guidelines for pool entry.
24. A Family Membership shall be defined as husband, wife, unmarried children, and/or any other relatives living at the same address. Single membership constitutes as only one person.
25. The YMCA will not be responsible for accidents or injury in connection with use of the facilities. We will also not be responsible for the loss or theft of personal belongings. The YMCA maintains the right to dispose of any unclaimed belongings after two weeks.
26. Current members can use the pool for parties during normal pool hours. The member must pay the standard fee of \$100 in the circumstance of a child's party, the visiting non-swimming parent or guest will not have to pay the guest fee in order to accompany their child.

Current members can also rent out the pool for an after hours party at the rate of \$50 per hour. A deposit of \$50 must be paid in advance to the pool. Guards can also rent out the pool but must pay the \$50 fee, pay for two guards and have manager approved adult supervision.

27. Vandalism of pool property and trespassing after hours will not be tolerated. Anyone who vandalizes club property may be punished up to expulsion from the pool facility. Depending on the severity of the damage, the management retains the right to contact local authorities with reference to criminal charges.
