WHAT to expect:

Students who attend the Grubb Family YMCA's After School Care can expect to have FUN! We designate time each day for homework upon students' arrival to the Y. While working, students will have staff present to help as they are able.

Your student will be placed in a group with others close to their age. Together, the group will have snack (provided from home), play games, learn about the Y's core values, do arts and crafts, and more!

All groups will have the option to swim on Friday afternoons from 4pm to 5pm, behavior and weather permitting.

WHEN we provide care:

After School Care begins August 24th, 2026 and ends on June 9th, 2027. We will not be providing care on June 10th or 11th as it is designated for our Camp Wauneka Staff Training. All students **MUST** be picked up by 6pm everyday. Pick up is outside, by the Splash Pad from 5-6pm, unless weather is poor. If so, sign out will be under the overhang at the entrance to the facility. We will communicate this via ClassDojo. If you wish to pick your student up prior to 5pm, you can do so inside at the front desk.

On days when school is out, we will provide Student Fun Days at **NO COST** for ASC participants! Trips taken on these days will be an additional cost to all students.

Payments will be withdrawn from the account provided on the 1st of every month. If you wish to stop your student's participation in our ASC program, you will need to contact Jocelyn to let her know, directly, via e-mail or ClassDojo. This is separate from canceling your membership!

Payments can be drafted from a credit card, checking account, or debit card. **PAYMENTS MUST REMAIN UP TO DATE TO ENSURE YOUR STUDENT'S SPOT IN OUR PROGRAM.** Financial Assistance is available through our Y for You scholarship program. Families with more than one student in attendance are eligible to receive a sibling discount of \$15 a month, per student.

Student Fun Day Information:

- Student Fun Days are subject to change from the dates below and are dependent upon the Randolph County School System Calendar.
 - Drop Off is 7:30am-8:30am.
 - All students must be picked up no later than 6pm.
 - Please make sure your student is prepared with a packed lunch, 2 snacks, and swimming attire on these days.
 - On Field Trip days, there will be a separate charge for your student to go on the trip.
